Dear Parents and Carers

We are delighted to let you know that all children in Key Stage 2 will be going to the Opera House in Manchester on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> April 2024 to see the live West End production of Awful Auntie by David Walliams.

Children will be required to take a packed lunch with them, this can either be brought from home or ordered from school. If your child will be having a packed lunch from school, please credit your ParentPay account with £2.88 for the price of a school meal unless your child is in receipt of Pupil Premium Free School Meals. The cost of the tickets for this trip to the Opera House including coach travel is £18.00 per child to be paid by ParentPay by 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2024.

# Ramadan 2024

Ramadan will start on Sunday evening into Monday, 11th March 2022 and will end around Tuesday 9th April 2024 (depending on the full moon) with Eid-ul-Fitr falling on either the 10th or 11th April 2024.

We understand and appreciate the dedication and commitment to this obligatory pillar of Islam and recognise that the holy month is an extremely important time for many of our Muslim children and families. However, children who fast may feel tired, find it difficult to concentrate and be at risk of dehydration.

To ensure that our children continue to learn to the best of their ability and are able to participate in all elements of the curriculum, we would recommend that our children do not fast on school days. However, we understand that young children may fast for part of the day to help them practise or to build tolerance to the experience. Therefore, if you wish for your child in year 5 or 6 to fast, we will support our students to do so.

Please confirm with the school office via email to mail@holdenclough.tameside.sch.uk that you consent for your child/children to fast whilst at school and that they can be given water should they become unwell or faint.

Children will not be able to fast without parental consent. Children younger than Year 5 should not fast during the school day and we will encourage students to break their fast only if it is a risk to their health and wellbeing.

As we work on a pre-order system for school meals and do not take dinner registers in the mornings, children's meals will continue to be ordered with the kitchen if they are present in school, unless we hear otherwise. All meals ordered will be added to ParentPay and payment will be required as normal.

For families observing Ramadan, we wish you well. We will celebrate Eid with a special assembly and an Eid party for all students and staff. The dates will be confirmed.

We would like to take this opportunity to wish Ramadan Kareem to all our Muslim parents from all of the staff at Holden Clough Primary School.

# Attendance: the top facts to know & share

## The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

- In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent (PA) children in KS2 achieved expected KS2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who regularly attended school.
- 36% of PA children in KS4 got 9 to 4 in their English and maths GCSEs, compared with 84% of regular attenders.<sup>1</sup>

## And it's never too late to benefit from good attendance:

• More than half (54%) of pupils who were PA in Year 10 and then rarely absent in Year 11, passed at least 5 GCSEs, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.<sup>2</sup>

## But attendance is important for more than just attainment:

• Regular school attendance can facilitate **positive peer relationships**, which is a **protective factor** for mental health and wellbeing.<sup>3</sup>
