
- 5 writing lessons each week.

Phonics

- Children in Year 1 throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week in June.
- It is a way for teachers to check how the children are progressing with their phonic learning.
- Good progress in phonics means the children are on track to become fluent readers who can enjoy reading for pleasure and for learning.

- Did you choose this book? Why?

- Would you read the book again? Why? Why not?

- Do you have a favourite book that you like to read?
- Is this a new book that you haven't read before? Do you know anything about it already?
- Do you enjoy reading?

Decode

Word reading and decoding skills

- What do you do if you are stuck on a word?
- Where do you start reading the word? Where do you look first?
- When you blend those sounds together, what word does it say? Can you tell me the word?
- Are there any clues in the word?
- Does it look like any other words you know?
- Can the pictures help you?
- Do you know what the word means or can you work out what it means (in this sentence)?
- What other word could the author have used that means the same sort of thing?
- Does the sentence make sense with that word?

What can you do at home?

Read lots of books with your child.

Listen to your child read as much as possible. Remember to sign the reading diaries to earn a raffle ticket!

Do one homework task each week and upload to the portfolio section on Class dojo. Your child will get the chance to share their homework with the class and they will be given 3 dojos!

Maths:

This half term we will learn how to:

- Sort objects.
- Count objects (to 10)
- Recognise numbers as words)
- Count forward within 10.
- Count backwards within 10.
- Show one more.
- Show one less.
- Use > and < and = to compare numbers
- Use bonds to 10.
- Add within 10.
- Subtract within 10.

Science

This science unit this half term is called 'Seasons'. It allows us to investigate the changing seasons with a specific focus on Autumn. Our learning will include:

- Seasonal changes.
- Changes in daylight.
- Autumn animals
- Autumn weather

We will also be heading out into the school grounds to explore the seasonal changes around us.



English

This half term, we will be developing our independent writing skills by becoming authors of our own poetry books! We will be using a range of 'mentor texts' to support our writing.

We will be focusing on:

- Letter formation
- Applying taught phonics.
- Finger spaces.
- Capital letters and full stops.
- Orally rehearsing sentences.
- Writing words and simple sentences and captions.



We will be building our reading fluency through weekly guided reading and daily phonics sessions.

RE

In RE we will be exploring the question: What does it mean to belong to a faith community?

We will think about how we all belong to something and how belonging is an important part of our lives.

We will look at signs of belonging in the Christian, Muslim and Jewish faiths.

PE Kit:

- White round neck t-shirt (no branded sportswear please)
- School jumper should be worn, with a black PE top brought in a bag for colder days.
- Black tracksuit bottoms or leggings (we may be outdoor for P.E.).
- Black trainers

PSHE

Through our PSHE learning we will:

- Recognise how attitude and behaviour, may affect others.
- Listen to, reflect on and respect other people's views and feelings.
- Work and play independently and in groups, showing sensitivity to others.
- Recognise how their behaviour affects other people

Geography

The children will:

- Locate where they live on an aerial photograph, recognising features within a local context.
- Create maps using classroom objects before drawing simple maps of the school grounds.
- Follow simple routes around the school grounds and carry out an enquiry as to how their playground can be improved.

Art

In art we will be looking at the work of Henri Matisse to explore shape and colour. We will be using this to inspire our own portraits.



Homework

Children in Y1 - 3 are provided with a homework mat each half term. One piece of work should be completed each week. The work should be uploaded to Dojo profiles and this work will be shared with the class during class assembly time.

Maths

Practice counting forward and backwards within 10.

Practise writing the numerals to 10. Make sure your numbers are formed correctly and are the right way around!



English

Look closely at the cover of a story book you have at home. What can you see? Write a simple sentence or some labels to tell me.

Don't forget to use your phonic knowledge to help you write your words.

Science

Go for a walk around your local area. What signs of autumn can you spot. You could collect some autumn object, take photos or draw pictures to show us.


PSHE

Complete a random act of kindness for someone in your family or a friend, you could help wash up, put the shopping away, draw someone a picture, share your snack.

Draw a picture, write a sentence or send a video to explain what you did.

Geography

Make a plan of your bedroom. You could use objects from around your house or draw a picture. Remember a plan is drawn from above (a bird's eye view!)



Art

Look at the work of Henri Matisse. His work uses really bright colours and lots of pattern. Create your own colourful pattern. You could use: felt pens, crayon, paint, collage. It's up to you!



Homework:

In addition to the homework mat, children should ideally also:

- Read for 10 minutes every night. For the majority of children throughout Y1, the focus of these reading sessions should be fluency (applying phonics to segment and blend words).
- Listen to stories as much as possible. The focus of these sessions should be to develop a love of reading and to enhance the children's understanding of vocabulary. The children will visit the KS1 library every week.
- Use Numbots regularly to develop a secure sense of number.

Communication :

Parents/Carers can speak with staff:

- At the beginning or end of the day.
- Via Dojo; please speak with me if you need help with Dojo. Messages sent to staff after 5:30 PM may not be responded to until the next school day.
- Homework and newsletters will be uploaded onto the school website and onto Dojo.

Reports/Parents' evening:

Two reports will be provided throughout the year, to provide you with updates regarding your child's progress. A mid-year report will be sent out in February, and an end of year report will be sent out in July.

Two parents' evenings will happen throughout the year. Information regarding these will be provided via Dojo and Parent's mail nearer the time.

Uniform:

Please ensure **ALL** items of clothing and belongings have your child's name in them!

Birthdays

- School policy requests children no longer bring in sweets or cake to celebrate their birthday due to us being a healthy school.
- Instead we are wanting to improve our class library therefore you can donate a book and we will read the book to the class.
- It will stay in that class library so children can enjoy reading it.
- We will still sing happy birthday to celebrate and children can still wear their own clothes on that day.

Other information:
