Geography

This half term in Geography we will be answering the enquiry question:

Can I carry out an independent fieldwork enquiry?

Pupils who are secure will be able to:

- Give examples of issues in the local area.
- Identify questions to be asked to find the relevant data.
- Justify which data collection method is most suitable.
- Design an accurate data collection template.
- Identify areas along a route that are best for data collection.
- Discuss how to mediate potential risks.
- Collect data at points located on an OS map.
- Manage risks during a fieldwork trip.
- Identify any outcomes from data collected.
- Map data digitally.

Mathematics

Within mathematics this term, we will be dipping our toes into the year 7 curriculum. As we fast approach high school, we will be doing lots of little mathematics projects to ease the transition from year 6 to year 7.

<u>Science</u>

This half term, children will be looking into Electricity.

- Step 1 Symbols in a Diagram

- Step 3 Buzzers and Motors
