<u>History</u>

In History, we will be exploring our enquiry question:

Who were the Ancient Greeks and how did they influence the world?

This unit is designed to explore Greek life, the achievements of Ancient Greece and its influence on the western world. Below you can find a list of the key vocabulary we will be covering this half term.

Mathematics

We'll begin the year by revisiting place value, building on the children's confidence in recognising, reading, and writing numbers up to 8 digits, as well as exploring how these numbers are composed. Alongside this, we'll be working with negative numbers and rounding, before moving on to the four operations, fractions, and finally geometry. A key focus this year will be fluency in times tables and division facts, as this underpins so much of the maths curriculum. To support this, TT Rockstars will continue to be a valuable tool for practice and consolidation. All logins will remain the same, and we'll reissue details just in case any have been forgotten.



Writing & Guided Read

In English this half-term, we'll begin with a baseline piece of writing in the form of a non-chronological report on Deadly Perils. From there, much of our work will be inspired by The Haunting of Aveline Jones (our guided read text). Using this text, the children will explore different writing styles and techniques, starting with letter writing in an informal, nonfiction context. We'll then focus on character descriptions, developing rich vocabulary and precise descriptive language, before moving on to setting descriptions where imagery and sensory detail will bring scenes to life. To finish, the children will apply these skills in a spooky narrative, concentrating on building atmosphere, suspense, and mood.

Science

This term, Year 6 are exploring the amazing variety of living things, from tiny microbes to plants and animals. They're learning about Carl Linnaeus and his system for classifying species, and will practise grouping organisms by their similarities and differences.

Parent's Information

If you want to support your child's learning at home, here are a few ideas you might like to try:

- Listen, read and discuss with your child the book they are reading at the moment. If you want to encourage your child to read more narrative/fiction ask your class teacher for ideas.
- Play times table games and practise division as well as multiplication facts.
